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About this report

Scope

The *Annual Report 2017–18* outlines the activities and achievements of the:

- Non-State Schools Accreditation Board (the ‘Board’) established on 21 September 2001 under the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2001* (repealed 1 January 2018), and continued in existence from 1 January 2018 under the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2017*; and
- Non-State Schools Eligibility for Government Funding Committee (the ‘Funding Committee’) established on 21 September 2001 under the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2001* (repealed 1 January 2018), until its cessation on 1 January 2018 by authority of the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2017*.

In this report, unless the context otherwise requires, the term:

- ‘Minister’ refers, on and from 12 December 2017, to the Honourable the Minister for Education and Minister for Industrial Relations and, prior to that date, to the Honourable the Minister for Education and Minister for Tourism, Major Events and the Commonwealth Games; and
- ‘Director-General’ and ‘chief executive’ refer, on and from 12 December 2017, to the Director-General of the Department of Education and, prior to that date, to the Director-General of the Department of Education and Training.

The report has been prepared in accordance with the legislative requirements of the *Financial Accountability Act 2009* and the *Financial and Performance Management Standard 2009*, and the detailed requirements set out in the *Annual report requirements for Queensland Government agencies* produced by the Department of the Premier and Cabinet.

This report is designed to inform a wide range of community stakeholders, including Members of Parliament, government agencies, persons in the education profession, students and the general public.

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Chairperson's message

I am pleased to present the 17th annual report of the Non-State Schools Accreditation Board and the Non-State Schools Eligibility for Government Funding Committee.

On 1 January 2018, the new *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2017* and the new *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Regulation 2017* replaced the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2001* and the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Regulation 2001*.

The new Act and Regulation introduced significant policy reforms across a range of areas, including: a more streamlined non-state school accreditation process; considerable simplification of the process of determining eligibility for government funding for non-state schools; and giving the Board responsibility for investigating and taking action on educational facilities operating without the required accreditation.

The number of non-state schools in Queensland continues to increase. At 30 June 2018, there were 511 operating non-state schools; an increase of seven from 504 at 30 June 2017 equating to a 1.39 per cent increase in 12 months.

At the time of the annual census of school enrolments in February 2018, 266,004 students were being provided with education services through non-state schools; which represents an increase of 0.7 per cent from 264,155 students at February 2017.

Schools offering special assistance have continued to be an important component of non-state schooling. At February 2018 census day, there were 29 accredited special assistance schools with one special assistance site for a mainstream school. This gives a total of 30 schools offering special assistance at one or more sites throughout the state. In 2018, schools offering special assistance accounted for 5.91 per cent (5.75 per cent in 2017, 5.43 per cent in 2016) of all non-state schools, and 0.97 per cent (0.94 per cent in 2017, 0.87 per cent in 2016) of all non-state school domestic enrolments.

During the reporting period:

- eight new non-state schools were established
- existing non-state schools established four new sites
- existing non-state schools offering special assistance established two new sites
- two schools surrendered their accreditation and ceased operating
- the accreditation of one school was cancelled.

During 2017–18, the Board continued its work to assist schools in strengthening their child protection policies and to assist governing bodies as they completed the annual census of enrolments in their schools.

The Board is committed to ensuring that the child protection policies of all schools are compliant with the legislative requirements.

From its inception, the Board has recognised and been committed to its duty regarding child welfare and will work within its jurisdictional influence to deliver on the school-related and student-related child protection reforms initiated by the *Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse*.

The new Act gives the Board additional responsibilities, which include investigating whether a person is operating a place as a school without accreditation, and taking appropriate action in the public interest under the Act. This work was previously undertaken by the Department of Education.

In the March 2018 reconstitution of the Board, the Government made two changes to its membership.

Professor Carol Nicoll PSM and Mr Terence Burke were appointed as nominees of the Minister from 8 March 2018, replacing Adjunct Professor William (Bill) Lane and Mrs Helen Royan.

I wish to pay tribute to the Board work of Professor Lane who was appointed as an inaugural member of the Board on 23 November 2001. Professor Lane's service to the Board, much of it as Deputy Chairperson, helped enormously in laying the foundations for the high quality of the Board's work from the outset, and his contributions over his 16 year term are valued enormously.

I also thank and commend the work of Mrs Royan who served as a member from 9 February 2017. Mrs Royan was able to draw on her considerable educational and governance expertise to provide valuable assistance with the Board's work.


I acknowledge and pay tribute to Emeritus Professor McLean for her outstanding leadership of the Board from 3 December 2009 until 31 May 2018. During these eight and a half years, Professor McLean presided over the Board, working untiringly in that capacity to help ensure the public has confidence in the standard of education in non-state schools in Queensland. Professor McLean was instrumental in many of the reforms under the new Act, and she led the Board's work as it transitioned to the new legislation on 1 January 2018, making the reforms as seamless and as streamlined as possible for schools and their governing bodies.

The new Act marked the cessation at the end of 2017 of the Non-State Schools Eligibility for Government Funding Committee. Serving for more than 11 years as Chairperson, Adjunct Professor James (Jim) Watters provided exceptional leadership of the Funding Committee as its members navigated their way through fine-grained analysis of applications for government funding eligibility against the then prescribed eligibility criteria. The Board bade farewell also to Mr Norman Hunter OAM, Mr Boyd Paties, Mr Allan Guse, Mr Michael Kearney and Mr Antony Skinner, all of whom provided valued contributions to the detailed analytical work of the Committee.

I acknowledge the involvement of the large numbers of educators, support staff and volunteers who contribute significantly to the success of non-state schools. Members of the Board seek to work collaboratively with school governing bodies with the aim of ensuring that the public has confidence in Queensland non-state schools.

I was deeply honoured to be appointed in June this year as Chairperson of the Board, and very enthusiastic about working shoulder to shoulder with all Board members to perform the functions prescribed under our authorising legislation.

I look forward to helping consolidate the reforms in the new legislation, and to maintaining productive relationships with governing bodies and non-state schools as we work towards achieving positive learning outcomes for Queensland students.

Agency role and main functions

Our vision

Non-State Schools Accreditation Board

The Board's vision is for excellence in education offered in non-state schools.

Non-State Schools Eligibility for Government Funding Committee

The now-discontinued Funding Committee's vision was for fair, impartial and transparent considerations regarding government funding eligibility for governing bodies of non-state schools.

Our values

Members of the Board and Funding Committee are committed to the following values, which they believe are critical in producing the best, most equitable and just decisions:

Integrity. We adopt a non-partisan approach to our work and are committed to being professional and ethical.

Objectivity, impartiality and independence. We are committed to acting in an objective, diligent and impartial manner.

Honesty. We are committed to being fair, trustworthy and straightforward.

Respect for others. We will treat all people with respect and courtesy, be open to views that may be different from our own, and promote the development of supportive working relationships within the educational and wider communities.

These values are consistent with the obligations of Board and Funding Committee members and authorised persons, described in the *Code of Conduct for Members of the Non-State Schools Accreditation Board, Members of a Committee of the Board and Authorised Persons appointed by the Board*, made under the *Public Sector Ethics Act 1994*. More information about the code of conduct can be found later in this report.

Our legislation

The new *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2017* ('**Accreditation Act 2017**') and the new *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Regulation 2017* ('**Accreditation Regulation 2017**') commenced on 1 January 2018 replacing respectively the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2001* ('**Accreditation Act 2001**') and the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Regulation 2001* ('**Accreditation Regulation 2001**').

The Accreditation Act 2017 and Accreditation Regulation 2017 introduced significant legislative reforms across a range of areas, including a more streamlined accreditation process and significant changes in the process of determining eligibility for government funding for governing bodies of non-state schools.

The foundations for the original Accreditation Act 2001 and Accreditation Regulation 2001 were largely laid by the 1999 review of accreditation and government funding arrangements for non-state schools chaired by Emeritus Professor Roy Webb AO, then Vice-Chancellor of Griffith University. The Accreditation Act 2017 and Accreditation Regulation 2017 arose from a review completed in 2016 of the Accreditation Act 2001 and Accreditation Regulation 2001.

The *Grammar Schools Act 2016* is relevant to non-state schools established under that Act. Other legislation is relevant to the operations of non-state schools in Queensland, such as the *Child Protection Act 1999*, the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006*, the *Education (General Provisions) Regulation 2006*, and the *Education (General Provisions) Regulation 2017*.

Amendments to legislation

There were no amendments to the Accreditation Act 2001 and the Accreditation Regulation 2001 during the reporting period.

There have also been no amendments to the Accreditation Act 2017 and Accreditation Regulation 2017 since commencement on 1 January 2018.

The *Education (General Provisions) Regulation 2017* (SL No. 161, date of notification 25 August 2017) came into force on 1 September 2017 replacing the *Education (General Provisions) Regulation 2006*. The *Education (General Provisions) Regulation 2017* made no material changes to the provisions relating to non-state schools to those contained in the *Education (General Provisions) Regulation 2006*.

The *Education (Overseas Students) Act 2018* (Act No. 1, date of assent 16 March 2018) has introduced new provisions, which came into force on 1 July 2018, related to:

- state and non-state schools insofar as fee-paying overseas students are concerned
- organisations (including state and non-state schools) insofar as international secondary student exchanges are concerned.

In addition to amending the regulatory regime for fee-paying overseas students, and establishing a new regulatory regime for international secondary student exchanges, the legislation authorises:

- the Director-General to disclose confidential information to the Board if satisfied the disclosure would assist in the performance of the Board's functions under the Accreditation Act 2017, and if the Director-General discloses confidential information, the information is protected information under the Accreditation Act 2017
- the Board to disclose protected information under the Accreditation Act 2017 to the Director-General if the Board is satisfied the disclosure would assist in the performance of the Director-General's functions under the *Education (Overseas Students) Act 2018*.

For the *Education (Overseas Students) Act 2018*, 'confidential information' means information about a person's affairs, but does not include: (a) statistical or other information that could not reasonably be expected to result in the identification of the person to whom it relates; or (b) information that is publicly available.

The *Education (Overseas Students) Regulation 2018*, made under the *Education (Overseas Students) Act 2018*, relates to fee-paying overseas students and became effective on 1 July 2018.

Machinery of government changes

The Board was affected by the Governor's declaration under the *Constitution of Queensland 2001*, section 43, that effective 12 December 2017, the office of Minister for Education and Minister for Industrial Relations is an office to which a person may be appointed as a Minister of the State. The office of Minister for Education and Minister for Tourism, Major Events and the Commonwealth Games was ceased.

On 12 December 2017, the Governor appointed the Honourable Grace Grace MP to the office of the Minister for Education and Minister for Industrial Relations.

Until that date, the Honourable Kate Jones MP was the Minister for Education and Minister for Tourism, Major Events and the Commonwealth Games.

The Board Secretariat was affected by the *Public Service Departmental Arrangements Notice (No. 3) 2017*, made under the *Public Service Act 2008*, which changed the name of the Department of Education and Training, on and from 12 December 2017, to the Department of Education.

Establishment of Board and Funding Committee

The Non-State Schools Accreditation Board and the Non-State Schools Eligibility for Government Funding Committee were initially established on 21 September 2001 under the Accreditation Act 2001 (now repealed).

The Funding Committee ceased to exist on 1 January 2018 by authority of the Accreditation Act 2017.

The Board, established under the now-repealed Accreditation Act 2001, has continued in existence from 1 January 2018 under section 97(1) of the Accreditation Act 2017.

Functions of Board changed, functions of Funding Committee ceased (on 1 January 2018)

With the commencement of the Accreditation Act 2017, the functions of the Board changed and functions of the Funding Committee ceased.

Functions of the Board (to 31 December 2017, inclusive)

The functions of the Board (to 31 December 2017, inclusive) were to:

- assess applications for accreditation of non-state schools
- accredit non-state schools complying with the accreditation criteria
- keep a register of provisionally accredited, and accredited, non-state schools
- monitor whether:
 - accredited schools continue to comply with the accreditation criteria
 - the governing body of a provisionally accredited, or accredited, school is suitable to continue to be the school's governing body
 - a government-funded school is a school not being operated for profit
 - the governing body of a government-funded school is not a party to a prohibited arrangement in relation to the operation of the school
 - there is no direct or indirect connection between the governing body of a government-funded school and another entity that could reasonably be expected to compromise the independence of the governing body when making financial decisions
- examine, and advise the Minister about, the operation of the accreditation scheme under the Accreditation Act.

Functions of the Board (on and from 1 January 2018)

The Board (on and from 1 January 2018) has the following functions:

- to assess applications for accreditation of non-state schools
- to accredit non-state schools
- to assess and decide applications about governing bodies' eligibility for government funding
- to keep a register of accredited schools
- to monitor whether accredited schools continue to comply with the accreditation criteria
- to monitor whether the governing bodies of accredited schools are suitable to continue to be a school's governing body

- to monitor whether the governing bodies of non-state schools that are eligible for government funding for the schools continue to meet the government funding eligibility criteria
- to monitor and enforce compliance with the Accreditation Act 2017
- to conduct investigations about contraventions of, or noncompliance with, the Accreditation Act 2017
- to examine, and advise the Minister about, the operation of the accreditation and eligibility for government funding schemes under the Accreditation Act 2017, including, for example, the examining of and reporting on a matter referred to the Board by the Minister
- another function given to the Board under the Accreditation Act 2017 or another Act.

Functions of the Funding Committee (to 31 December 2017, inclusive)

The functions of the Funding Committee (to 31 December 2017, inclusive) were to:

- assess, or reassess, the eligibility of a school's governing body for government funding for the school
- make recommendations, for the Minister's consideration, about the eligibility of a school's governing body for government funding for the school.

The Minister (to 31 December 2017, inclusive) was the decision maker on eligibility for government funding.

In assessing applications for funding for new schools, and for existing schools whose accreditation status had changed, the Funding Committee took account of complex and, at times, sensitive issues such as:

- anticipated enrolments
- the extent of educational choice based on the religious, philosophical or educational approaches the school proposed to offer
- enrolment capacities of other schools in the catchment area
- the impact on neighbouring state and non-state schools in the short term and over the following five years
- the projected population of school-aged children likely to reside in the school's catchment area within five years after the school's student-intake day (for new schools), and five years after the year in which the application was being considered (for existing schools).

Functions of the Funding Committee (on and from 1 January 2018)

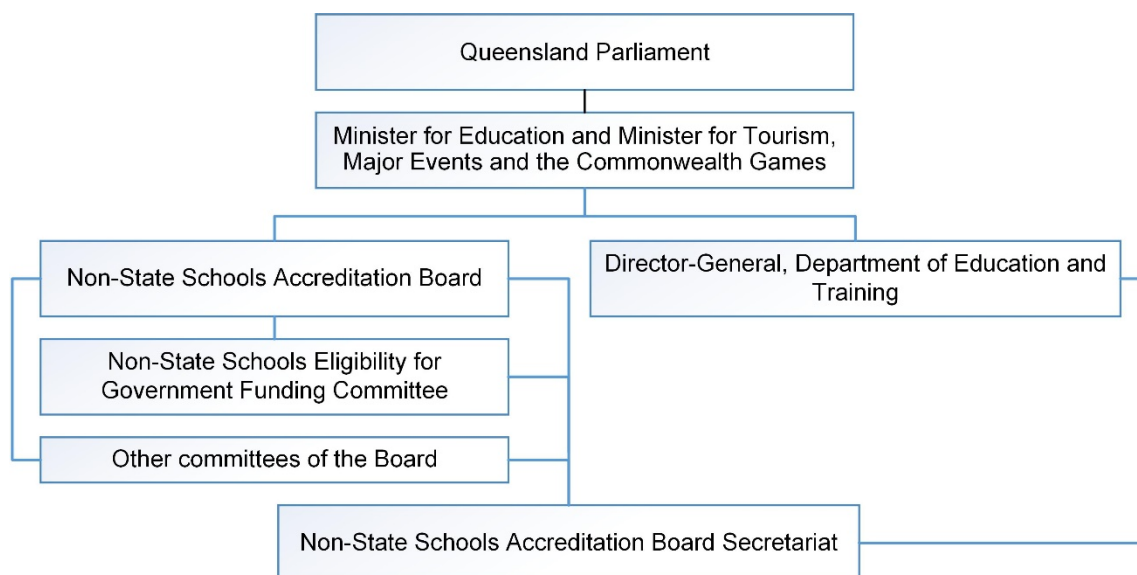

Display 1: Accountability and reporting structure of the Board, Funding Committee, and other committees (Accreditation Act 2001)

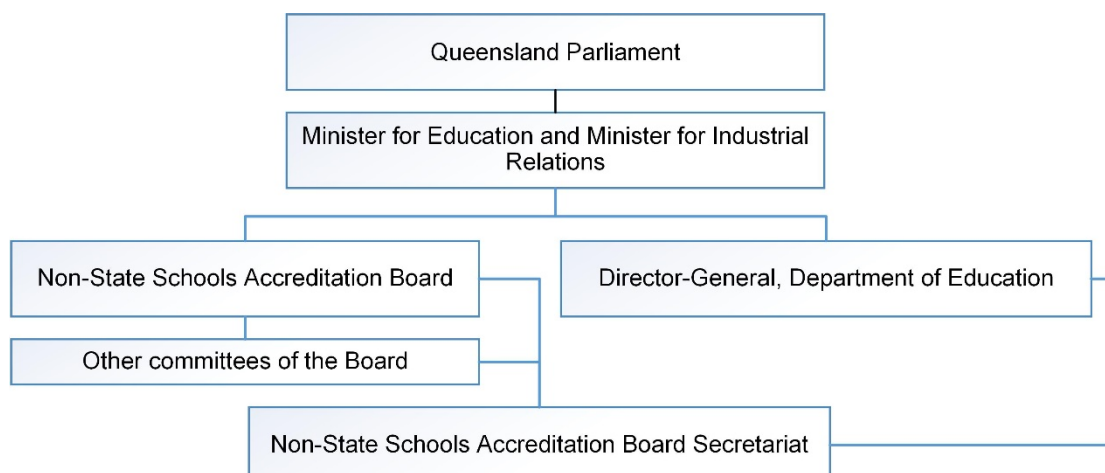


Organisational structure (on and from 1 January 2018)

Operating environment

Queensland demography

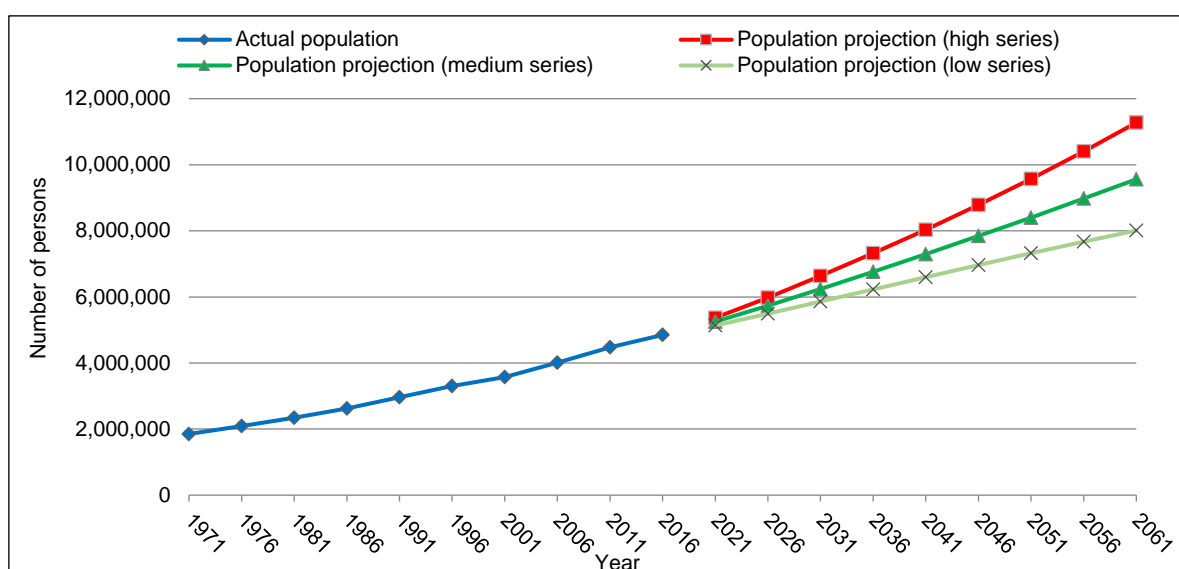
The population of Queensland has more than doubled in 40 years. It has increased from 2.09 million people in 1976 to 4.85 million in 2016, which amounts to an increase of 2.76 million or 132 per cent.

In the 30 years from 2016 to 2046, the population is expected to grow by another 3.0 million to 7.84 million (medium series projection). This represents a growth of approximately 62 per cent over 30 years.

By 2061, the population in Queensland is expected to reach 9.56 million (medium series projection). Compared with the population in 2016, Queensland is expected to have another 4.7 million people in 2061 (medium series projection).

Display 8 shows the population growing from 4.85 million in 2016 to 9.56 million in 2061 (medium series). The high and low series represent a range of likely alternative population growth scenarios.

Display 8: Actual and projected Queensland population, 1971 to 2061



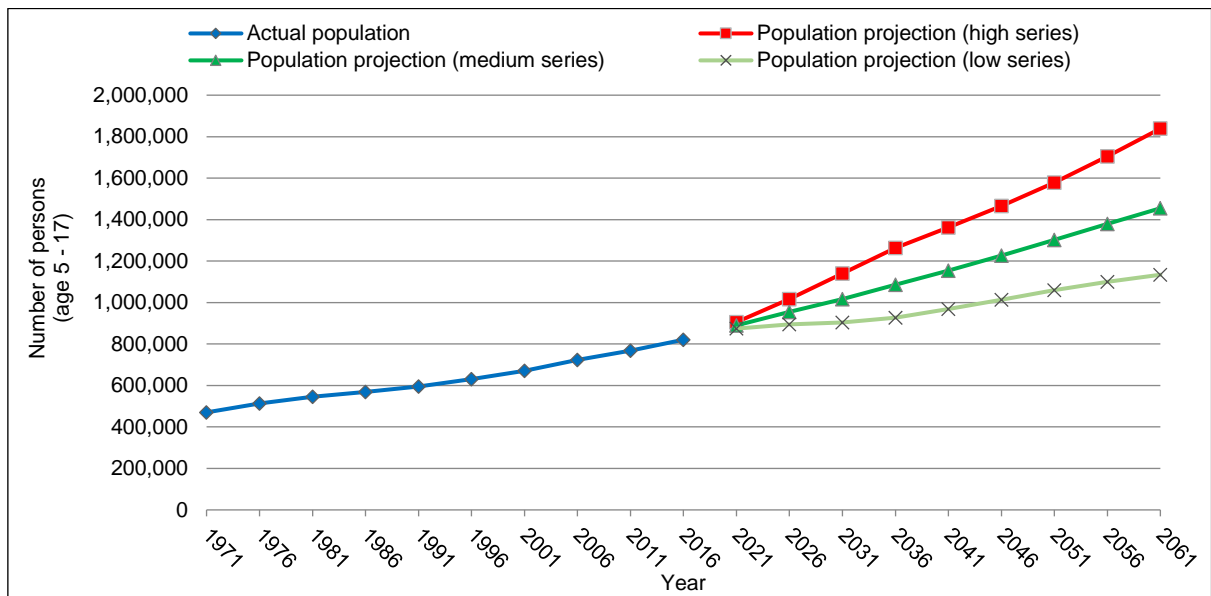

Display 9 shows an increase in Queensland's population of children aged 5 to 17 years from 820,691 in 2016 to 1,454,735 in 2061 (medium series). This is an increase of 634,044 over 45 years. This growth in Queensland's population translates into an increased need for educational services for students up to the age of 17 years.

Display 10 and Display 11 show that the number of Queensland children and young people (aged 5 years to 11 years, and 12 years to 17 years respectively) grew by 225,739 in total in the 25 years between 1991 and 2016. In the 25 years between 2016 and 2041, a further increase of 333,894 is expected. In the 20 years between 2041 and 2061, an increase of 300,151 is forecast, reaching 1,454,735 by 2061 (medium series).

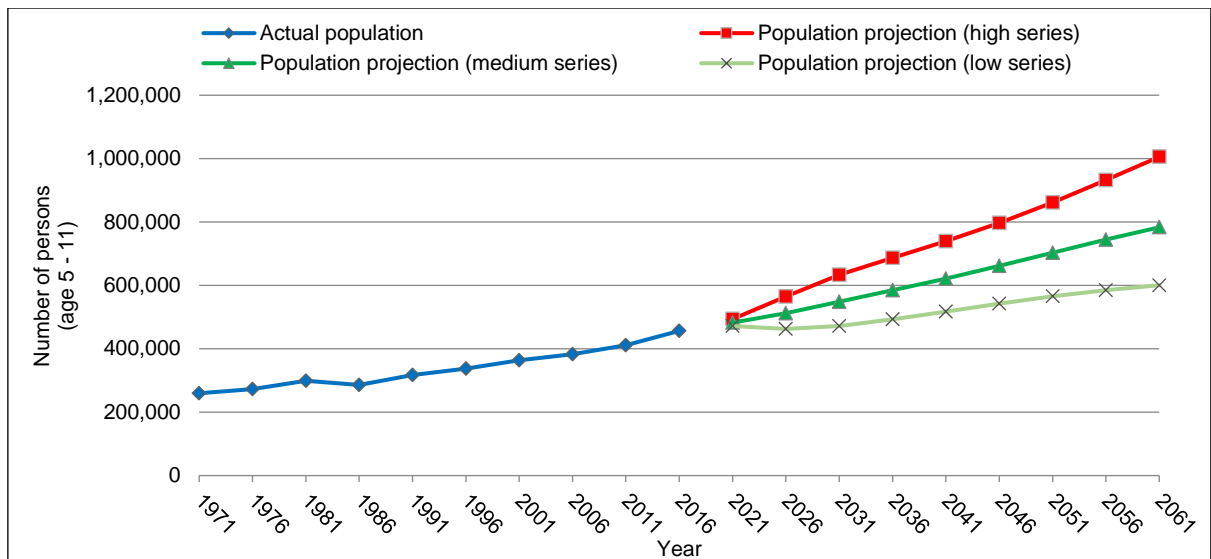
If the high series predictions are reached, the number of children and young people in 2061 will be 1.84 million, more than double the population in 2016 (0.821 million).

Display 9: Actual and projected Queensland population by age, 5 to 17 years, from 1971 to 2061



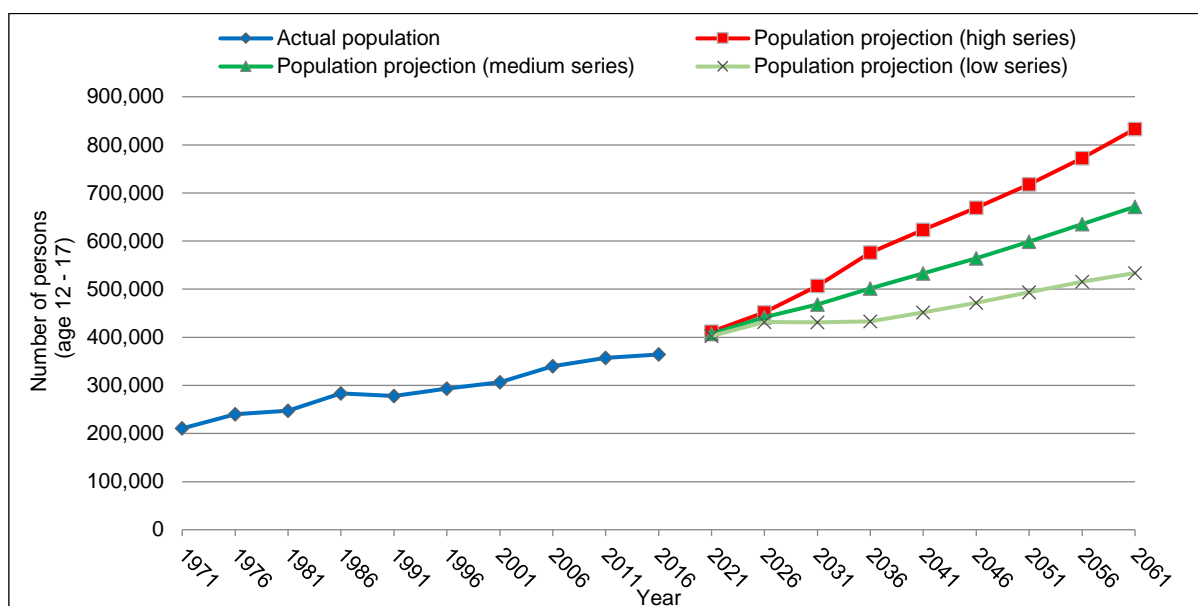

The schools

At the end of the 2017–18 financial year, there were 511 operating non-state schools. Included in this total were eight schools established as grammar schools within the meaning of the *Grammar Schools Act 2016*.

On 30 June 2017, there were 504 accredited and operating non-state schools, and two schools accredited, but temporarily not operating. During the reporting period, eight new schools commenced – one offering primary education, three offering secondary education, three offering primary and secondary education, and one offering special education. Four existing schools commenced operations at additional sites.

Of the 504 accredited and operating non-state schools at the end of the 2016–17 financial year, one school divided the school into two separated schools, with the dividing school being surrendered and each site recorded as a separated school on the register of non-state schools. One of the separated schools is currently not operating. One of the two schools that was temporarily not operating, surrendered its accreditation, and the other school had its accreditation cancelled by the Board. One school that had not commenced operations by 30 June 2017 also surrendered its accreditation before commencement.

Of the four new sites, one site temporarily ceased operations.

One existing site also declared temporary cessation of operations. The governing body of another accredited non-state school declared an existing site as no longer applicable to the school. Two existing sites of accredited non-state schools were removed as an attribute of accreditation by the Board.

The 511 operating non-state schools at 30 June 2018 comprised 52 single-gender (29 female only and 23 male only) and 459 coeducational schools. There are 500 schools offering classroom education, ten schools accredited to offer classroom and distance education, and one school accredited to offer distance education only. Out of the ten schools accredited to offer classroom and distance education, one was offering only classroom education and another was offering only distance education as a mode of delivery during the reporting period.

A total of 51 non-state schools were accredited for boarding, however one school did not offer boarding during the reporting period.

Under current arrangements, non-state schools receive funding from the Queensland Government (if eligible for government funding), the Australian Government, and from private sources, mainly in the form of fees.

In 2017-18, the State Government allocated \$774.8 million in funding to non-state schools, including \$676.4 million in recurrent funding and \$98.4 million in capital assistance.

The students

In 2002, there were 9428 preschool students, 91,826 primary students and 86,268 secondary students enrolled in 439 non-state schools. At that time, this total enrolment of 187,522 students represented 28 per cent of all Queensland school students.

At Census Day, 23 February 2018, there was a total of 266,004.5 students recorded in the 504 non-state schools in operation. Of this total, 133,739.3 were primary students (including 18,350.5 students in the preparatory year) and 132,265.2 were secondary students.

This is an increase of 1849.3 students from February 2017, which constitutes a 0.70 per cent growth.

The total enrolment numbers include 3211 students receiving distance education from the 11 non-state schools offering that mode of delivery.

¹ One school not operating surrendered its accreditation and another not operating had its accreditation cancelled in 2017-2018.

Among the total student population, there were:

- 12,253.2 students with English as a second language
- 10,649.8 Indigenous students
- 10,625.4 students with disability
- 4156.0 students from isolated areas.

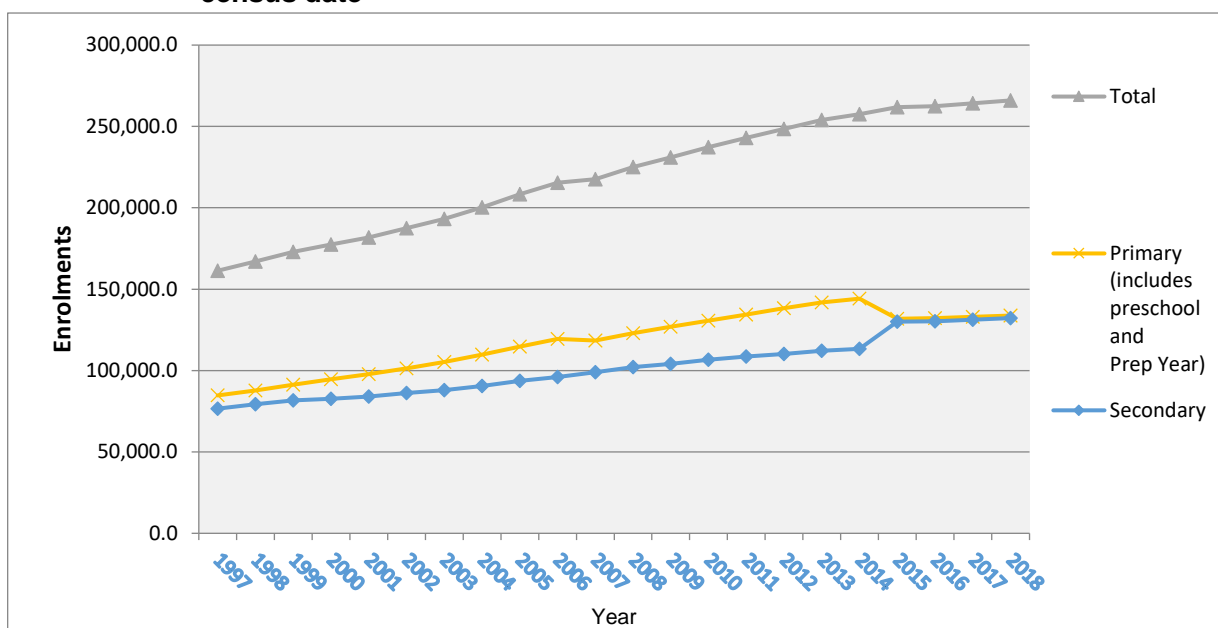
Not included in the total figures are 2076 overseas students who are responsible for the cost of their own education.

Combined, the 268,080.5 domestic and overseas students represent 32.57 per cent of all Queensland school students.

Display 15 shows the number of enrolments in non-state schools from 1997 to 2018 at February census date. The numbers represent an average increase of approximately 2.42 per cent for each of the 21 years.

Over the same period, the average increase for primary education, including preschool and the preparatory year, was 2.24 per cent for each year, and the average increase for secondary education was 2.67 per cent for each year. There were fewer primary education enrolments in 2007 (-0.8 per cent), which may be attributed to the half-cohort intake of preparatory year students in that year. As a result of the transition of Year 7 to secondary, there were fewer primary education enrolments in 2015 (-8.5 per cent). There was a consequent increase in secondary education enrolments of 14.8 per cent.

Critical issues

Critical issues that the Board faces as it plans for the future include:

- impacts of both state and federal government policy changes
- changing nature of education and related community expectations
- rapid changes in technology and the effects on education

- changing pathways to work and post-school education
- changing nature of work
- widening diversity of educational choice
- working towards ensuring that disengaged children and young people can access educational opportunities and pathways that meet their needs
- changing social fabric of the Australian community
- continued implementation of the Australian Curriculum, and pending changes to senior schooling in Queensland
- continued monitoring of the implementation in non-state schools of child protection legislation
- continued implementation of the school- and student-related child protection reforms initiated by the *Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse*
- consolidation of reforms in the legislation commencing in 2018 relating to the accreditation and government funding eligibility of non-state schools
- continuing to exploit opportunities for business optimisation of the Board's work
- continued strengthening of systems and controls related to the provision by governing bodies of non-state school census data and the verification of enrolments.

Business operations

Accreditation

To operate in Queensland from 1 January 2018, a non-state school must be accredited by the Board under the Accreditation Act 2017.

The Board must accredit the school if it is satisfied, in relation to each type of education proposed to be provided by the school, that:

- the applicant is suitable to be the school's governing body
- the school will comply with the prescribed accreditation criteria from the school's student-intake day for the type of education.

Prior to 1 January 2018, a school could operate if it was provisionally accredited under the Accreditation Act 2001. Provisional accreditation is not a category of accreditation under the Accreditation Act 2017.

Applications for accreditation

During the reporting period, the Board received 39 applications for accreditation, changes of accreditation attributes, changes in provisional accreditation period or changes to relevant student-intake days. Refer to Display 16 and Display 17.

Out of the 39 applications received, the Board made decisions on 24 applications. (Display 18).

Still under consideration by the Board on 30 June 2018 were one application for a new type of education, 11 applications for a change of accreditation attributes (including one under review from 2016-2017) and one application to change the relevant student-intake day.

A summary of the type and scope of applications for accreditation for new schools and for the addition of a type of education to existing schools is provided in Appendices 3 and 4.

Appendix 5 provides a summary of the type and scope of applications for changes of attributes, changes to periods of provisional accreditation and changes to the relevant student-intake day.

Notice of attribute no longer applying, from 1 January 2018

From 1 January 2018, a school's governing body may, by notice given to the Board, advise the Board that an attribute of accreditation of the school no longer applies to the school.

The Board received four notices advising that a certain attribute of accreditation no longer applies to the school. On the effective date of the notice, the Board has amended the register to remove the attribute from the attributes of accreditation applying to the school, and has given the governing body of the school notice that the attribute of accreditation no longer applies to the school.

Appendix 5 shows an overview of notices received by the Board.

Provisional accreditation to accreditation, to 31 December 2017

Twelve non-state schools had an assessment scheduled to commence from 1 July 2017 until 31 December 2017. The Board gave approval for seven of those schools to move from provisional accreditation to accreditation. Two schools had their provisional accreditation extended for another year. By virtue of the transition provisions of the Accreditation Act 2017, these two schools were taken to be accredited schools from 1 January 2018.

One school issued with an Information Notice under section 67 of the Accreditation Act 2001 in the 2016-2017 reporting period had its accreditation cancelled and the school closed in October 2017.

Appendix 8 provides a summary of schools moving from provisional accreditation to accreditation.

The three assessments that had not been completed by 31 December 2017 were transitioned and continued under the Accreditation Act 2017.

Initial assessments, from 1 January 2018

From 1 January 2018 until 30 June 2018, 10 schools were scheduled to commence an initial assessment under section 30 of the Accreditation Act 2017. All 10 assessments were still in progress by the end of the reporting period.

Appendix 8 provides a summary of schools scheduled for an initial assessment.

Assessment of sectors of schooling, to 31 December 2017

One non-state school that had commenced operating within a sector of schooling at an existing site had an assessment scheduled to commence from 1 July 2017 until 31 December 2017. The Board transitioned and completed this assessment under the Accreditation Act 2017.

Two non-state schools that had commenced operating within a sector of schooling at a new site had assessments scheduled to commence from 1 July 2017 until 31 December 2017.

One assessment was completed, while the other was transitioned and will be completed under the Accreditation Act 2017. Each of these was assessed by a Board-appointed assessor.

Appendix 8 provides a summary of Board decisions relating to schools commencing new sectors at existing or new sites.

Assessments of establishment phase schools and when schools start to operate at a new site, from 1 January 2018

From 1 January 2018 until 30 June 2018, nine schools were scheduled to commence an establishment phase assessment under section 30 of the Accreditation Act 2017. All nine assessments were still in progress by the end of the reporting period.

Appendix 8 provides a summary of schools scheduled for an establishment phase assessment.

In the same period, five schools were scheduled to commence a new site assessment under section 32 of the Accreditation Act 2017. All five assessments were still in progress by the end of the reporting period.

Appendix 8 provides a summary of schools scheduled for a new site assessment.

Assessors, to 31 December 2017, inclusive

Section 144 of the Accreditation Act 2001 provided for the appointment of assessors by the Board.

Nine assessors who were appointed in the previous reporting period continued in their role this year, with one of those assessors resigning to take up a key role within another government statutory authority in August 2017. Two of these assessors are forensic financial accountants, and two have particular expertise in curriculum development and implementation.

Authorised persons, from 1 January 2018

Under the transitional provisions of the Accreditation Act 2017, the eight assessors continued in their role as authorised persons with their appointments to end on 31 December 2018.

Four additional authorised persons were appointed in 2018 under the Accreditation Act 2017.

Two authorised persons with specific expertise and experience in investigations were appointed to help the Board determine whether there are operations of unaccredited schools, specifically the offence of a person operating a school without accreditation, and the offence of a person holding out a school as accredited if not accredited.

The Board also appointed two other forensic financial accountants for a specific assessment.

Accreditation certificates

The Board issued new and amended certificates of accreditation as required under the Accreditation Act 2001 until 31 December 2017. There is no legislative requirement to issue certificates of accreditation under the Accreditation Act 2017.

Surrender of accreditation, to 31 December 2017

Section 70A of the Accreditation Act 2001 gave a school's governing body the option of surrendering the accreditation or provisional accreditation of the school. The surrender was by way of a notice given to the Board by the school's governing body.

During the period 1 July 2017 to 31 December 2017, the governing bodies of two schools surrendered the whole-of-school accreditations.

Appendix 12 provides information on surrenders of accreditation to 31 December 2017.

Surrender of accreditation, from 1 January 2018

Section 73 of the Accreditation Act 2017 provides for a school's governing body to provide a surrender notice to the Board to surrender the accreditation of an accredited non-state school.

During the period 1 January 2018 to 30 June 2018, the governing body of one school surrendered the whole-of-school accreditation.

Appendix 12 provides information on surrenders of accreditation from 1 January 2018 to 30 June 2018.

Cancellation of accreditation (show cause notices), to 31 December 2017

Under the Accreditation Act 2001, the Board was authorised to cancel a non-state school's accreditation in certain circumstances and under the relevant statutory processes. The key grounds on which the Board was able to base a cancellation relate to the suitability of a school's governing body and a school's compliance with the statutory accreditation criteria.

If accreditation was cancelled, under section 99 of the Accreditation Act 2001, eligibility for government funding for the school was taken to be withdrawn when the cancellation took effect.

During the period 1 July 2017 to 31 December 2017, the Board issued and resolved three show cause notices proposing to cancel part of a school's accreditation. Two notices were issued to two schools to surrender sites. For another school, the Board took no further action because the school applied to change the attribute of accreditation.

Appendix 11 shows summary data for cancellation actions by the Board from 1 July 2013 to 30 December 2017.

Amendment and cancellation accreditations (show cause notices), from 1 January 2018

Under Part 6, Division 2 of the Accreditation Act 2017, the Board can issue a show cause notice proposing to either amend or cancel a school's accreditation.

During the period 1 January 2018 to 30 June 2018, the Board issued six show cause notices proposing to cancel the accreditation of a type of education. No further action was taken on five notices because the ground no longer existed, and one notice was not finalised by 30 June 2018.

The Board also issued three show cause notices proposing to amend a school's accreditation due to non-compliance with an accreditation criterion relating to an attribute of accreditation. While two show cause notices had not been finalised by 30 June 2018, one had been finalised and no further action taken.

Appendix 11 shows summary data for cancellation actions by the Board from 1 July 2013 to 30 June 2018.

Compliance notices, to 31 December 2017

Under section 61 of the Accreditation Act 2001, the Board was able to issue a compliance notice to a non-state school's governing body if the Board reasonably believed that the school was not complying with an accreditation criterion and the matter relating to the non-compliance was reasonably capable of being rectified. The notice required the governing body to rectify the matter. The governing body was to comply with the compliance notice, unless the governing body had a reasonable excuse.

During the period 1 July 2017 to 31 December 2017, one compliance notice was issued by the Board due to non-compliance with an accreditation criterion. Because the notice was not finalised by 31 December 2017, the notice was transitioned and taken to have been given under section 62(3) of the Accreditation Act 2017. One other compliance notice that was issued in 2015-2016 has also been transitioned and has been finalised under the new Act.

Appendix 10 contains information on compliance notices issued from 1 July 2013 to 31 December 2017.

Compliance notices, from 1 January 2018

Under section 62 of the Accreditation Act 2017, the Board may issue a compliance notice to a non-state school's governing body if the Board reasonably believes that the school is not complying with an accreditation criterion, or the governing body of a school is no longer suitable to be the school's governing body, and the matter relating to the non-compliance is reasonably capable of being rectified. The notice requires the governing body to rectify the matter. The governing body must comply with the compliance notice, unless the governing body has a reasonable excuse.

During the period 1 January 2018 to 30 June 2018, one compliance notice was issued by the Board and was still outstanding at the end of the reporting period.

Appendix 10 contains information on compliance notices issued from 1 January 2018 to 30 June 2018.

Complaints handling

The Board is an independent body that has certain prescribed statutory responsibilities under the Accreditation Act 2017. It is therefore reasonable to expect that persons who have issues with non-state schools or their governing bodies will make complaints about these entities to the Board. Complaints may be about aspects of school operations or particular incidents that happen in schools.

The Board's jurisdiction under the Accreditation Act 2017 is confined to a limited number of matters in relation to non-state schools. The two key areas of this jurisdiction are whether the governing body of a non-state school is suitable to continue to be the school's governing body, and whether a school is complying, or has not complied, with one or more of the statutory accreditation criteria prescribed by the Accreditation Regulation 2017.

In the reporting period, the Board received complaints regarding 38 governing bodies. The nature of the complaints was varied but generally related to alleged breaches of the statutory accreditation criteria and, at times, to the suitability of the governing body. Some complaints received, however, were not of a type that fell within the jurisdiction of the Board.

Eligibility for government funding

To be eligible for government funding in Queensland from 1 January 2018, a non-state school's governing body must be approved by the Board as eligible for government funding for the school under the Accreditation Act 2017.

A governing body of a school is eligible for government funding for the school if the Board is satisfied the governing body meets the government funding eligibility criteria prescribed under the Accreditation Act 2017.

Prior to 1 January 2018, a governing body's eligibility for government funding for a school was determined by the Minister under the Accreditation Act 2001 (after taking into account a recommendation by the Funding Committee) if the governing body met the funding eligibility criteria prescribed under that Act.

Applications for eligibility for government funding, up to 31 December 2017

From 1 July 2017 to 31 December 2017, four new applications for eligibility for government funding were received by the Funding Committee.

These consisted of two applications for new schools and two applications for variations to existing schools.

Of the applications received in that period, the Funding Committee made recommendations on eligibility for government funding to the Minister for all four applications. One of the new school applications had not been finalised by 31 December 2017 and transitioned under section 184 of the Accreditation Act 2017. The application was taken to be an application by the governing body to be eligible for government funding for the school under section 78(1) of the Accreditation Act 2017 and decided by the Board.

Appendix 6 and 7 provide a summary of the type and scope of applications for eligibility for government funding.

Applications for eligibility for government funding, from 1 January 2018

The Board received two applications for eligibility for government funding from 1 January 2018 to 30 June 2018. Both applications had been finalised by the end of the reporting period.

Appendix 6 and 7 provide a summary of the type and scope of applications for eligibility for government funding.

Times for Board to make certain decisions

The statutory processes have changed between the Accreditation Act 2001 to the Accreditation Act 2017 to make them more streamlined.

Appendix 3 shows the times for the Board to make its decisions on accreditation for new schools under both Acts, and Appendix 4 for existing schools to add a type of education.

Amalgamation of schools by amalgamation notice, and dividing schools by division notice

The Accreditation Act 2017 provides for the amalgamation of existing schools by amalgamation notice, and the dividing of existing schools by division notice, given to the Board by a governing body. If the Board is satisfied that the prescribed matters are met, it issues a Board notice to the governing body concerned. If the Board is not satisfied that the prescribed matters are met, it issues an information notice to the governing body concerned.

Appendix 9 shows the number of notices within the reporting period.

Offences

On 1 January 2018, the Board became responsible under the Accreditation Act 2017 for the function of conducting investigations and undertaking proceedings in connection with offences under that Act. Any proceedings initiated by the Board for an offence are to be taken in a summary way under the *Justices Act 1886*.

Appendix 13 shows the number of instances assessed, actions arising, and the number and outcome of any proceedings initiated by the Board in respect of the operations of unaccredited schools specifically, the offence of a person operating a school without accreditation, and the offence of a person holding out a school as accredited if not accredited.

Appendix 13 also shows the number and outcome of any other proceedings initiated by the Board.

Programs

Review program — accreditation and, if relevant, eligibility for government funding (to 31 December 2017, referred to as cyclical review program)

Using the cyclical review program under the Accreditation Act 2001 as a foundation, the Board has established a periodic review program under the Accreditation Act 2017. The term ‘review program’ is a better alignment with the Accreditation Act 2017. To be clear, up to 31 December 2017, this program was referred to under the Accreditation Act 2001 as the ‘cyclical review program’.

Under the review program, the Board, on the basis largely of material supplied by schools’ governing bodies, considers whether a school’s governing body is, or continues to be, suitable to be the school’s governing body, and whether a school is complying with the prescribed accreditation criteria and, if a governing body of a school is eligible for government funding for the school, whether the Board is satisfied the governing body meets the prescribed government funding eligibility criteria.

For the review program under the Accreditation Act 2017, the Board is authorised, once every five years during a school’s accreditation, to give the school’s governing body a notice asking the governing body to give the Board information or a document that may help the Board in deciding:

- whether:
 - a school’s governing body is, or continues to be, suitable to be the school’s governing body (Act, s 170); and
 - a school is complying with the prescribed accreditation criteria (Act, s 170); and
- if a governing body of an accredited school is eligible for government funding for the school — whether the Board is satisfied the governing body meets the prescribed government funding eligibility criteria (Act, s 171).

For the present reporting period, the governing bodies of 139 schools successfully demonstrated to the Board their schools’ ongoing compliance with the statutory obligations of their accreditation and government funding eligibility.

A forward schedule for the review program is established to ensure all schools participate in the program at a minimum of once every five years. Schools’ governing bodies may choose to participate in the program more frequently by contacting the Board and nominating a suitable year.

A central feature of the review program continues to be the manner in which the review process contributes to ongoing school improvement. Increasingly, schools and their wider communities are using data collated from a range of sources to effectively monitor teaching, learning, and school management practices and outcomes, and to transparently account for their performance and achievement.

Through their review and renewal processes, schools reflect on their performance, build their knowledge base, and make informed decisions to drive effective change and to deliver better outcomes.

During the reporting period, the Board continued to support schools’ compliance with statutory requirements for the protection of students through the review of schools’ student protection written processes submitted with review program reports.

In November 2017, to assist governing bodies and schools, the Board developed and published the *Non-State Schools Accreditation Board’s Review Program Guidelines for the demonstration of compliance with the Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2017*.

Annual collection of school survey data

In February 2018, the Board conducted its annual collection of school survey data (also known as the state census of non-state schools), thereby meeting its statutory obligation under section 168 of the Accreditation Act 2017.

Under the Accreditation Act 2017, governing bodies of accredited non-state schools must provide the Board with the prescribed school survey data.

Generally speaking, school survey data relates to the number of students enrolled in various years of schooling. This information is used primarily as a basis for allocating any allowances paid per capita.

A total of 508 non-state schools were operating as at Census Day and completed the *School Survey Data for Non-State Schools – Qld 2018*. This year a number of additions were made to the *Instructions for Completing School Survey Data for Non-State Schools – Qld 2018* (Instructions) and other supporting documents. Continuing the work from 2017, the examples and vignettes in the Instructions were further enhanced and expanded. The census instrument and the Instructions were reviewed and amended to improve alignment. Support was also available to governing bodies and schools via telephone and email from the Board Secretariat.

Census Day each year is the last Friday in February. For the reporting year, this was 23 February 2018.

The information received in the data collection for the 550 sites was subjected to visual and electronic validation checks by the Board Secretariat. A number of schools were also selected for enrolment verification.

Enrolment verification of 2018 school survey data

In 2018, the Board-appointed authorised persons completed the Board's annual compliance program to verify school survey data supplied by the governing bodies of non-state schools through the *School Survey Data for Non-State Schools – Qld 2018*, under section 168 of the Accreditation Act 2017.

The Board's 2018 verification of school survey data, which ran from mid-March to early May 2018, was carried out on a sample of 76 non-state schools on 79 sites offering classroom and/or distance education.

This equated to a sample of approximately 15 per cent of non-state schools in Queensland.

Auditors, to 31 December 2017, inclusive

The appointment of auditors by the Board fell under section 144 of the Accreditation Act 2001.

Auditors had the function, under section 142 of the Accreditation Act 2001, of verifying school survey data relating to a provisionally accredited, or accredited, school given to the Board under section 166 (School survey data) of the Accreditation Act 2001.

Authorised persons, from 1 January 2018

On 2 November 2017, the Board approved the appointment of five authorised persons to verify school survey data relating to accredited schools for the 2018 collection. On 23 November 2017, a further seven authorised persons were appointed, with possible extension to 2019 and 2020.

Annual allowance acquittal program, to 31 December 2017, inclusive

Under the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006*, the governing body of each non-state school with eligibility for government funding must, within six months of the end of each calendar year, give the Board their allowance acquittal details for the school for that year.

The allowance acquittal details were provided by way of a statement showing how the governing body expended State Government grants and allowances during the year. Not providing the Board with the required acquittal details within the legislated timeframe was a ground for stopping payment of the allowances under the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006*.

The 2017 allowance acquittal program ran from May to July 2017. The program involved the Board issuing a statement to each governing body, listing the State Government grants and allowances paid to their respective schools in 2016. In total, the Board distributed 505 forms, covering 498 schools, to 154 governing bodies. Schools accredited for classroom and distance education received one acquittal form for each mode of delivery, and one special assistance school received a separate form. Completed acquittal forms were required by the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006* to be returned to the Board by 30 June 2017.

The Board was required to give the Minister a written report about the acquittal details it received as soon as practicable. At its meeting on 3 August 2017, the Board endorsed the report on the 2017 allowance acquittal program for State Government grants and allowances paid to non-state schools in 2016. The report was submitted to the Minister.

This process changed on and from 1 January 2018. From that date, the governing body of each non-state school, for which an allowance is being paid under section 368(1)(b) of the *Education (General Provisions) Act 2006*, must give allowance acquittal details to the Minister in the way prescribed under that Act.

Governing body update program

The Board has a statutory obligation to monitor the suitability of a governing body of an accredited school and, to that end, the Board maintains information about governing bodies and their membership.

Board updates of governing body information include surveying each governing body at least once each year to collect information about the accuracy of contact details, the name of the chairperson/president, and particulars about directors (such as names and blue card/exemption card details).

For 2017, the governing body update program was conducted during October 2017.

Positive notices

Under the Accreditation Act 2017, each director of a non-state school's governing body must have:

- (a) a current positive notice (blue card) or
- (b) if the director is a registered teacher or police officer – a current positive exemption notice (exemption card).

Both of these notices are issued under the *Working with Children (Risk Management and Screening) Act 2000*.

Under section 26(3) of the Accreditation Act 2017, the governing body of a non-state school is not suitable to be, or to continue to be, a school's governing body unless each director of the governing body has either a current positive notice, or a current positive exemption notice.

Governing bodies play a vital role in monitoring the positive notice status of their own directors, and must, within 28 days, provide details to the Board of the appointment or cessation of a director.

Regional visit program

The Board and Funding Committee have conducted a program of regional meetings and school visits since 2002. The regional visit program is designed primarily to facilitate visits to as many non-state schools as possible in a geographical area.

Small groups of members attend schools, using the visit as an opportunity to gain an insight into the issues schools are currently addressing. The visits are therefore intended for familiarisation purposes only, and are not part of the formal accreditation and assessment of government funding eligibility work undertaken by the Board.

Regional visits are valuable opportunities for members to meet with school principals and representatives of school governing bodies as a whole, as well as to understand local needs.

In September 2017, Board and Funding Committee members participated in a local regional visit to the Emerald/Mount Isa areas. Members visited four schools in Mount Isa, four schools in Emerald and one school in Cloncurry. In October 2017, the Board and Funding Committee members visited two schools in the Proserpine area.

Members valued the opportunity to visit schools in these areas and to talk with school staff and members of the governing bodies.

Policies and procedures

Codes of conduct, *Public Sector Ethics Act 1994*

The Board is a public sector entity, and the Board's Chairperson is the chief executive officer of the entity, for the purposes of the *Public Sector Ethics Act 1994*. The Minister is the relevant responsible authority under that Act.

As required under the *Public Sector Ethics Act 1994*, the Board has developed and adopted the codes of conduct that the Minister, as the relevant responsible authority, has approved.

Given the nature and extent of changes between the Accreditation Act 2001 and the Accreditation Act 2017 (including cessation of the Funding Committee on 31 December 2017), during November 2017 the Board undertook a review of the earlier approved:

- *Code of Conduct for Members of the Board, the Funding Committee, and other committees of the Board*; and
- *Code of Conduct for Authorised Persons appointed by the Board under the Accreditation Act 2001*.

At the conclusion of the review, the Board adopted a single code, viz.: the *Code of Conduct for Members of the Non-State Schools Accreditation Board, Members of a Committee of the Board and Authorised Persons appointed by the Board*.

This code was approved by the Minister on 7 March 2018, replacing the previous two codes.

The Non-State Schools Eligibility for Government Funding Committee Business Procedures, to 31 December 2017, inclusive (Accreditation Act 2001)

Under section 126(5) of the Accreditation Act 2001, the Board was authorised to decide matters about the Funding Committee and any other committees of the Board that were not provided for under the Accreditation Act 2001 including, for example, the way a committee must conduct meetings.

On 5 September 2002, the Board approved the *Non-State Schools Eligibility for Government Funding Committee Business Procedures* ('Funding Committee Business Procedures').

The Funding Committee Business Procedures were confined to the Funding Committee and do not extend to other committees that the Board is authorised to constitute from time to time.

The Funding Committee Business Procedures are not a statutory instrument within the meaning of that term in the *Statutory Instruments Act 1992*.

Board procedure for notice of resolution not considered at a Board meeting, effective 1 January 2018 (Accreditation Act 2017)

The Board, by authority of section 117(7) of the Accreditation Act 2017, has developed and published a *Procedure for notice of resolution not considered at a Board meeting*, effective 1 January 2018.

Board policy for reporting to law enforcement agency

The Board developed and approved a *Policy for reporting to a law enforcement agency*, which became effective on 5 April 2018.

The Board, in the course of performing its functions and discharging its duties under the Accreditation Act 2017, receives information from another party alleging a breach of the law, or independently concludes that the law may have been breached.

The Board considers that it has a responsibility to report alleged and possible breaches of the law to a relevant law enforcement agency, and to that end has:

- established arrangements to fulfil that responsibility in an effective and efficient manner
- determined that matters are to be reported as soon as reasonably practicable
- determined that reliance is not to be placed on others to report.

The Accreditation Act 2017 and the *Information Privacy Act 2009* restrict how the Board may disclose certain information. The Board must consider the application of these Acts to establish it has authority to disclose information about a breach of law.

The policy sets out the principles of action for members of the Board to disclose information to a law enforcement agency.

Board policy on confidentiality, use and disclosure of meeting papers

The Board revised its 2013 version of its *Policy on confidentiality, use and disclosure of meeting papers* to accommodate both the Board's revised *Code of Conduct* (approved by the Minister on 7 March 2018) and the Accreditation Act 2017.

Consequently, the Board developed and approved a new *Policy on confidentiality, use and disclosure of meeting papers*, which became effective on 3 May 2018.

The policy applies to each member of the Board and Committee, and sets out the requirements in relation to the handling, use, release, and retention of meeting papers by members.

Purchasing procedures (Assessors), to 31 December 2017

The Board has in place *Purchasing Procedures (Assessors)*. These procedures were developed in accordance with the *State Procurement Policy*, which, at the time, applied to all public sector agencies, government-owned corporations and statutory bodies.

The procedures, in conjunction with sections 144 and 145 of the Accreditation Act 2001, provide a framework for the Board to:

- recruit suitably qualified and experienced persons as assessors
- assign assessments to particular assessors in an appropriate manner
- provide fair remuneration for the work that gives an appropriate level of assurance to the Board about receiving value for money.

Purchasing procedures (Authorised persons), from 1 January 2018

In accordance with the transitional provisions under section 182 of the Accreditation Act 2017, these Purchasing Procedures are still in effect under the new legislation.

Accountabilities

Corrections to previous annual reports

There are no corrections made to the previous annual report of the Board.

Board involvement in key initiatives

The Board continued to monitor legislation in force and under draft that might affect the governance and operations of non-state schools.

Budget of the Board

Under section 130(1) of the Accreditation Act 2001, the Board was required to develop and adopt a budget for each financial year and submit that budget to the Minister for approval.

On 3 August 2017, the Board adopted a budget for the 2017–18 financial year (total expenditure \$802,184) and submitted the budget to the Minister.

On 6 September 2017, the Minister approved the budget as adopted by the Board.

There are no provisions in the Accreditation Act 2017 prescribing the way in which the Board is to develop and adopt a budget for a financial year, and requiring the Board to submit the budget to the Minister for approval, and prescribing that the Board must comply with its approved budget for the financial year, and the related liability of members for a financial disbursement not provided for in the approved budget.

Nonetheless, it is the Board's intention for the 2018–19 financial year to develop and adopt a budget for the year, and submit the budget to the Minister for noting.

Details of Ministerial directions, Accreditation Act 2001, section 103 — review decisions

Sections 101 to 103 of the Accreditation Act 2001 dealt with the conduct of a review by the Minister of certain decisions of the Board.

If the Minister reviewed a Board's original decision and referred that decision back to the Board for further consideration, the Minister may give the Board a direction under section 103. The Board was obliged to comply with any such directions.

The Accreditation Act 2001 required the Board to include details of any such directions received by it in the Board's annual report.

The Board had not received any directions under section 103 during the reporting period.

Details of Ministerial directions, Accreditation Act 2001, section 108 — public interest

Under section 108 of the Accreditation Act 2001, the Minister may give the Board written directions about the performance of its statutory functions if the Minister is satisfied the direction is necessary in the public interest. The Board was obliged to comply with any such directions.

The Accreditation Act 2001 required the Board to include copies of any such directions received by it in the Board's annual report. The Minister had not given any directions under section 108 during the reporting period.

Details of Ministerial directions, Accreditation Act 2017, section 123 — public interest

Under section 123 of the Accreditation Act 2017, the Minister may give the Board a written direction about a matter relevant to the performance of the Board's functions under the Act if the Minister is satisfied it is necessary to give the direction in the public interest. In the Board's annual report for a financial year, under the *Financial Accountability Act 2009*, the Board must include copies of all directions given to it under this section during the financial year.

During the reporting period, the Minister has not given the Board any written direction under section 123.

Conferences and seminars

In April 2018, Board members and officers of the Board Secretariat participated in a Crown Law training workshop on *Sound Decision-making*.

External scrutiny

Auditor-General, report 11: 2017–18

Following the Auditor-General's financial and related audit of the Board for the 2016–17 financial year, on 22 February 2018 the Auditor-General submitted a report entitled *Queensland state government: 2016–17 results of financial audits* (report 11: 2017–18) to the Legislative Assembly.

For the Board, the Auditor-General issued an unmodified audit opinion (audit certification date 7 August 2017).

Feedback from clients on performance

The Board sought written feedback from all applicants (that is, governing bodies) for which a Board decision was made during the reporting period.

Each applicant was asked by email to provide feedback through an online questionnaire for each application lodged.

The questionnaire was deliberately kept to seven questions so as to require a minimal amount of time for respondents to complete. Respondents were also invited to provide comments beyond the set questions.

Although respondents were not required to identify themselves, the majority included identifying details in the optional section of the questionnaire.

Twenty-six governing bodies, which covered 33 applications, were approached for feedback, with 19 responses being received.

Internal audit function

The Board has not established an internal audit function, on the basis of the following:

- the Board is audited annually by the Queensland Audit Office
- the Board has in place a comprehensive system of identifying areas of operational and financial risk, and has arrangements in place to manage those risks
- the Board Secretariat, as part of the Department of Education, is subject to audit by that department's internal auditors.

Risk management

The Board has in place a system for effectively managing risks that may affect its operations. The system is consistent with the *Financial Accountability Act 2009* and the *Financial and Performance Management Standard 2009*.

On the basis that the Board is a relatively small agency, and that the potential risks and consequential costs would be generally medium to low, the Board has not established a risk management committee at this time, and the functions normally associated with a committee are undertaken by the Board as a whole.

Workforce planning, performance, early retirement, redundancy and retrenchment

Because officers of the Board Secretariat are officers of the Department of Education, details of workforce planning, performance, early retirement, redundancy and retrenchment, and support for mental and physical wellbeing will be included in that department's annual report.

Information systems and recordkeeping

Board ICT Business System

During the reporting period, the *Board ICT Business System* (MS Access database) was upgraded to accommodate the changes to the Board's and Minister's functions and powers, the cessation of the Funding Committee, under the Accreditation Act 2017, and to gain general efficiencies in business operations.

The upgraded business system was delivered by 1 January 2018, corresponding with the commencement of the Accreditation Act 2017.

The cost of upgrading the business system was borne by the department, and developed consistent with the department's *Project Management Capability and Competency Strategy 2017*, and is supported by a departmentally-funded maintenance and support contract.

The business system provides excellent facility and efficiency in data management, control and reporting. The system is able to undertake a wide range of data analyses and provide extensive reports to support the work of the Board. This allows information to be provided to the Board and the wider community more expeditiously.

The business system is the principal data source for the Board.

Register of non-state schools, Accreditation Act 2001

To 31 December 2017 inclusive, as required by section 164 of the Accreditation Act 2001 the Board maintained a register of provisionally accredited and accredited non-state schools.

The register contained the following information:

- the school's name
- if the school is provisionally accredited, its student-intake day, provisional accreditation period, and attributes of provisional accreditation
- if the school is accredited, the day of its accreditation and attributes of accreditation
- details of the type of education the school may provide
- whether the school is accredited, or provisionally accredited, to provide special assistance.

The register was open for inspection at the Board Secretariat by members of the public during ordinary office hours. There was no charge for inspecting the register.

Register of accredited non-state schools, Accreditation Act 2017

On and from 1 January 2018, as required by section 126 of the Accreditation Act 2017, the Board maintains a register about accredited non-state schools.

The register is kept in electronic form as part of the Board ICT Business System.

The register contains the following information for each accredited school:

- the school's name
- the day of its accreditation
- the student-intake day for each type of education the school may provide under the school's accreditation
- if the school is an establishment phase school for a year of schooling, the student-intake day for the year of schooling

- the attributes of accreditation of the school
- details of the type of education that may be provided at the school
- whether the governing body for the school is eligible for government funding
- other information prescribed by regulation.

No other information is prescribed in the Accreditation Regulation 2017.

The register is open for inspection, on payment of the fee prescribed under the Accreditation Regulation 2017, at the Board's office by members of the public during ordinary office hours.

The Board will give a person a copy of the register, or a part of it, on payment of the fee prescribed under the Accreditation Regulation 2017.

Under the Accreditation Regulation 2017, the prescribed fee is 50 cents for each page, or part of a page, of the register. The Board may waive, wholly or partially, payment of the fee if it is satisfied payment of the fee would cause financial hardship to the person liable to pay it. Also, the Board may waive payment of the fee if it is satisfied on reasonable grounds that the anticipated cost to the Board for collecting the fee makes it uneconomical to collect the fee.

Records management system

Records of the operations of the Board and the Funding Committee are maintained in accordance with the *Public Records Act 2002*.

The Board uses a quarantined part of the secure recordkeeping system of the Department of Education for the capture, management, storage, and retrieval of its electronic documents.

Under a Standing Offer Arrangement, secure and confidential storage of the Board's hardcopy files is provided off site.

Retention and disposal schedule

The *Non-State Schools Accreditation Board Retention and Disposal Schedule*, approved by the State Archivist on 10 February 2004, covers all functional records created by the Board, including records relating to applications for accreditation and funding eligibility for non-state schools, compliance with accreditation criteria, ministerial referrals and decisions, and other miscellaneous functions assigned under legislation.

Authorisation for the disposal of public records is given under the provisions of section 13 of the *Public Records Act 2002*.

Open data strategy

In the reporting period, the Board reviewed its open data strategy in line with government requirements. The strategy is meant to identify, assess and prioritise data for release; outline a four-year forward plan for delivery of the initiative; and include other topics, such as approaches to governance, regulatory compliance, and an objective to minimise duplication of effort.

The Board's updated strategy and its *Open Data Strategy 2018–2021* was published online in June 2018.

Data published under the Board's *Open Data Strategy 2018–2021* is available on the Board's website, and via the Queensland Government Open Data website at www.data.qld.gov.au.

Performance report

Government objectives for the community

Strategic plans are public statements of how the Board and Funding Committee will undertake their statutory obligations and contribute to the government's social and fiscal objectives during the period covered by the plan.

The Board and Funding Committee contributed to the government objectives for the community that existed under the *Financial Accountability Act 2009* at the commencement of the reporting period by:

- upholding the standards of education in non-state schools
- maintaining public confidence in the operation of non-state schools
- fostering educational choice in Queensland
- providing the basis for sound decisions about government funding for non-state schools.

The *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2017*, the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Regulation 2017* and the government's social and fiscal objectives for the state provide the framework within which strategic plans are developed.

Strategic Plan 2017-2021 and Operational Plan 2017-2018

For the reporting period, the Board operated within the scope of the *Strategic Plan 2017-2021* approved by the Board before the start of the period. Also, the Board operated within its *Operational Plan 2017-2018*.

The Board developed and approved each of these plans consistent with the requirements placed on statutory bodies by the *Financial and Performance Management Standard 2009*, made under the *Financial Accountability Act 2009*.

As with strategic plans in previous years, the 2017-2021 plan included goals, strategies and performance indicators for the Board and Funding Committee.

The vision and values that guide and underpin the Board and Funding Committee in their operations are stated at the front of this annual report.

When developing the *Strategic Plan 2017-2021* and the *Operational Plan 2017-2018*, members were very conscious of the challenges, priorities and key strategic risks existing at the time. These are set out in the *Strategic Plan 2017-2021*.

Summary of Board's financial performance

Board's funding source

The Board's funding source is comprised of an appropriated amount specified in the *Service Delivery Statements (Department of Education)* and an allocation by the Department of Education.

The Board also receives interest on its bank account, which is not included in this summary of financial performance.

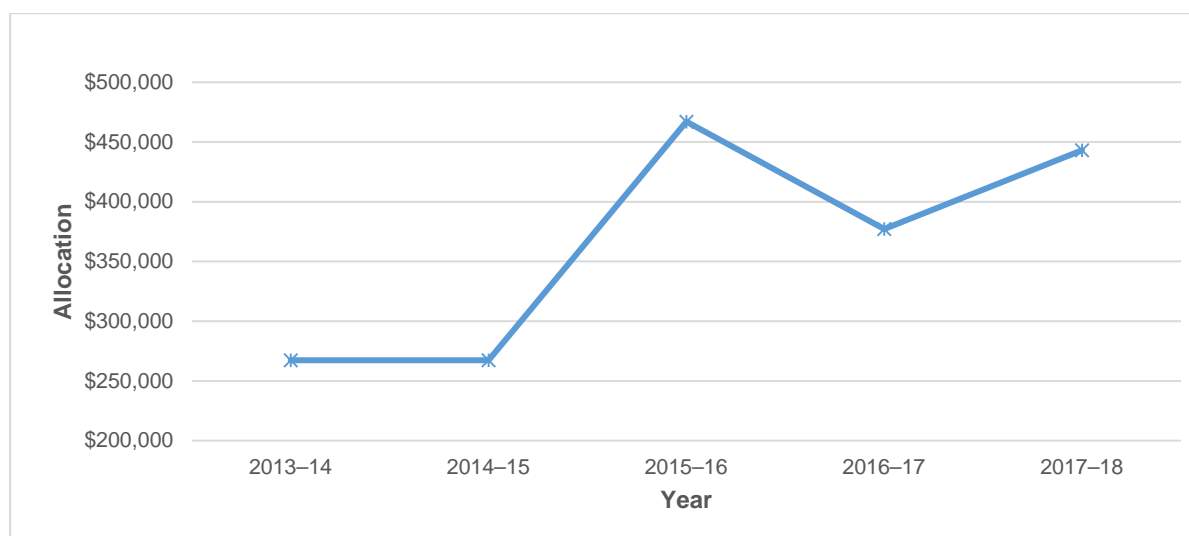
The Board receives material corporate services free of charge from the Department of Education. These corporate services would have been purchased if they had not been contributed by the Department. The fair value of those services at cost is recognised as Contributed Service Revenues and Expenses in the Board's Statement of Comprehensive Income in the Board's Financial Reports. For 2017–18, this corporate services amount contributed was \$1,345,261. This amount does not form part of this summary of financial performance.

For each of the five years to and including 2017–18, the allocation in the Service Delivery Statements has been \$54,000. This amount is combined with the Department of Education allocation for the purpose of this summary of financial performance.

The Board received \$443,013 for its operations in 2017–18, an increase of \$66,000 (17.5%) over the previous year.

Display 20: Funding allocation to Board in the five years to 2017–18

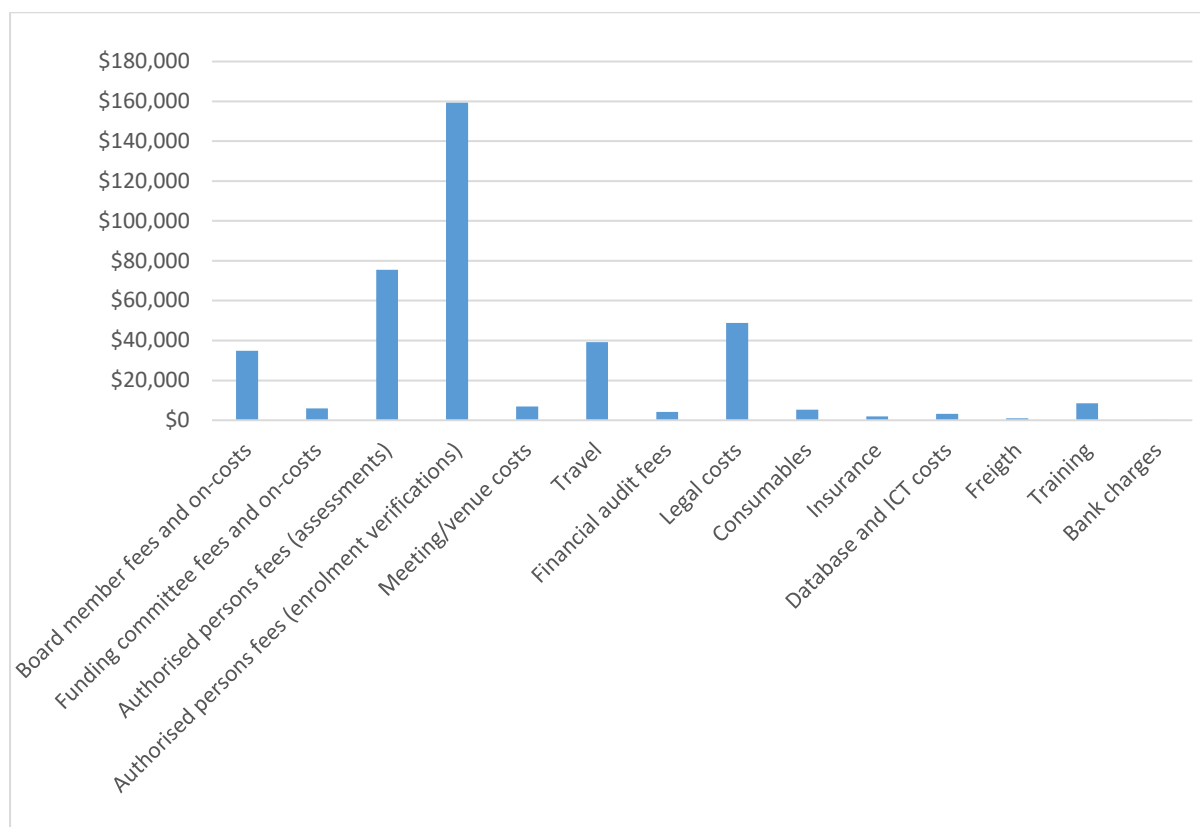


Board's expenditure

Display 21 shows the Board expenditure by budget category in 2017–18.

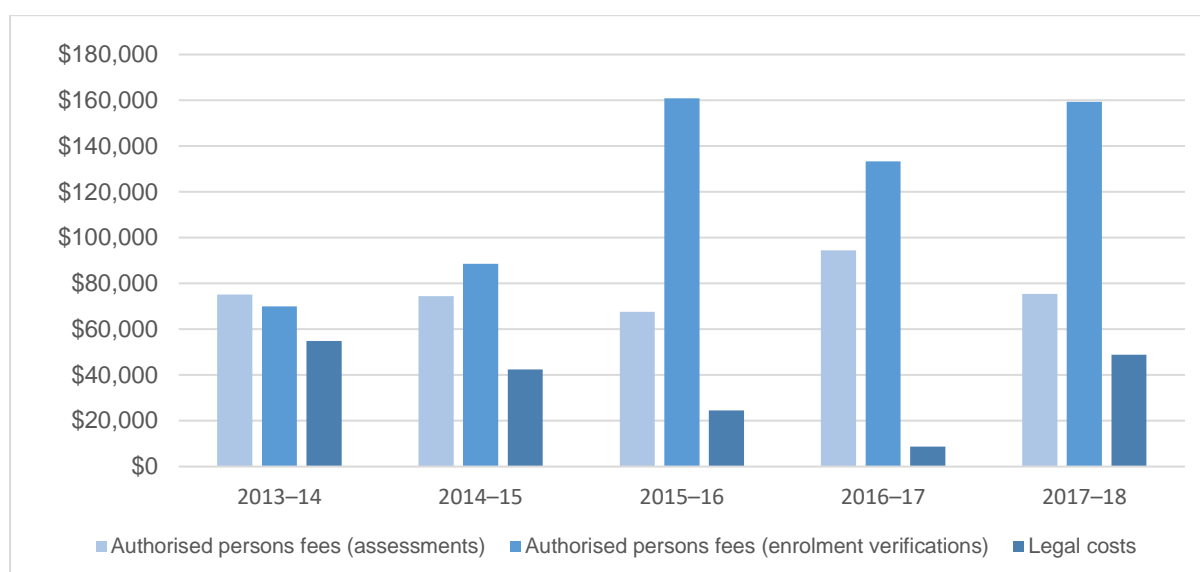
Display 21: Board expenditure by budget category in 2017–18

Since its establishment in 2001–02, the Board's expenditure each year has been within its annual budget.

The Board remains in a sound financial position at the end of 2017–18.

The Board is monitoring the costs associated with the new function given to it on 1 January 2018 under the Accreditation Act 2017 for investigating places operating without the required accreditation, and for taking action under the Act as the Board determines necessary.

Note 1 – Basis of Financial Statement Preparation

(a) General Information about the Reporting Entity

These financial statements cover the Non-State Schools Accreditation Board (the Board). The Board is a Statutory Body established under the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2001* (repealed 1 January 2018), and continued in existence from 1 January 2018 under the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2017*. The Board does not control other entities. The financial statements include the value of all income, expenses, assets, liabilities and equity for the Board as an individual entity.

(b) Authorisation of Financial Statements for Issue

The financial statements are authorised for issue by the Chair of the Board and Executive Director of the Board's Secretariat at the date of signing the Management Certificate.

(c) Compliance with Prescribed Requirements

The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with the *Financial Accountability Act 2009* and the *Financial and Performance Management Standard 2009*.

The Board is a not-for-profit entity and these general purpose financial statements are prepared in compliance with the requirements of Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements and Interpretations applicable to not-for-profit entities.

The financial statements are prepared on an accrual basis (with the exception of the statement of cash flows which is prepared on a cash basis).

(d) Underlying Measurement Basis

The historical cost convention is used as the measurement basis unless otherwise stated.

(e) Presentation Matters

Currency and Rounding – Amounts included in the financial statements are in Australian dollars. Amounts are rounded to the nearest dollar.

Comparatives – Comparative information reflects the audited 2016-17 financial statements.

Current / Non-Current Classification – Assets are classified as 'current' where their carrying amount is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting date. Liabilities are classified as 'current' when they are due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting date, or the Board does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement to beyond 12 months after the reporting date.

(f) Taxation

The Board is exempted from income tax under the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1936* and is exempted from other forms of Commonwealth taxation with the exception of Fringe Benefits Tax (FBT) and Goods and Services Tax (GST).

Receivables and payables in the Statement of Financial Position are shown inclusive of GST. GST credits receivable from, and GST payable to, the ATO at reporting date are recognised.

Note 2 – Grants and Other Contributions

Accounting Policy

Grants and contributions that are non-reciprocal in nature (i.e. do not require any goods or services to be provided in return) are recognised as revenue in the year in which the Board obtains control over them at the time of receipt. Grants and contributions relate to funding and services received from the Department of Education.

The Board also receives material corporate services free of charge from the Department of Education. These corporate services would have been purchased if they had not been contributed by the Department. The fair value of those services at cost is recognised as Contributed service revenues and expenses in the Statement of Comprehensive Income.

Additional Disclosures

The entire amount of \$443,013 from grants for 2017-18 represents a grant from the Department of Education.

The Committee ceased on 1 January 2018 by authority of the *Education (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2017*.


